

2025 SSBA ADOPTED RESOLUTIONS WORK PLAN – March 2026 Update

All adopted SSBA 2025 Resolutions have been shared with the Minister and Ministry of Education as well as the Leader and Shadow Education Minister of the Official Opposition. Work plans are in development, and any action/updates to date are noted below:

AGM 25-02 BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Saskatchewan School Boards Association advocate to the University of Saskatchewan, the University of Regina and the First Nations University of Canada to increase pre-service teacher education support in the areas of curriculum delivery, literacy instruction, differentiated instruction and assessment; ensuring that future educators are equipped with the foundational skills and pedagogical strategies necessary to meet the diverse learning needs of Saskatchewan students.

- Raised with the Dean of the Faculty of Education, University of Regina during a delegation visit with the Executive in December 2025.

AGM 25-03 BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Saskatchewan School Boards Association advocate to the Government of Saskatchewan for dedicated funding to use at the discretion of each school division and to support each school division in meeting the requirements of The Accessible Saskatchewan Act and commitment made in each school division's respective accessibility plan.

AGM 25-04 BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Saskatchewan School Boards Association direct the appropriate committee or working advisory group to create a comprehensive Policy Framework Advisory Document on Artificial Intelligence in Education, which will include but will not be limited to: • Set guiding policy considerations for ethical and effective use of AI in education • Define policy considerations related to equity, access and student data privacy. • Provide framework for member boards to adapt and apply AI policy within their local contexts. • Include a review process so the document remains current as technologies evolve.

- WAG and Terms of Reference approved by the Executive in December 2025. The WAG held its first meeting and members attended the AI Summit in Saskatoon in later January 2026. The SSBA WAG held its second meeting on March 3, 2026. The WAG includes representatives from SSBA, Government of Saskatchewan, LEADS, STF, SASBO, SDLC, U of R, and U of S.
- The WAG is committed to developing Saskatchewan-specific guidance that builds understanding and centres student and educator voices. The WAG's work will continue to align with ongoing initiatives in school divisions to ensure efforts are complementary. Engagements are planned to continue with educators, administrators, students, and Indigenous scholars.

AGM 25-06 BE IT RESOLVED that the Saskatchewan School Boards Association advocate with the Saskatchewan Association of School Business Officials to the SAO and the Ministries of Education and Social Services for the development of regulations grandfathering the Boards' aged infrastructure until the Province of Saskatchewan provides adequate and dedicated funding for accessible infrastructure renewal that is separate and apart from the Ministry's 3-year Preventative Maintenance and Renewal (PMR) Plan and funding for Ongoing Operation and Maintenance.

- Resolution has been shared with the Deputy Minister and Minister of Education. Further follow-up and advocacy required.

AGM 25-07 BE IT RESOLVED the Saskatchewan School Boards Association advocate to the Government of Saskatchewan to: • Provide full transparency on the allocation and redistribution of Section 16 tuition funding amounts withheld from school divisions; and • Ensure the federal funding amounts remain with and are reinvested in First Nations and Métis students enrolled in publicly funded school divisions, in order to support equity of opportunity and success for all students.

- Resolution has been shared with the Deputy Minister and Minister of Education, and the issue has been raised at the national level through CSBA. Further analysis follow-up and advocacy required.

AGM25-08 BE IT RESOLVED that the Saskatchewan School Boards Association advocate to the federal government to enact legislation focused specifically on protecting children from online harms, by requiring online platforms to manage and mitigate harmful content, while respecting the rights and freedoms of all Canadians.

- The issue has been raised at the national level through CSBA and further follow-up and advocacy is being planned.

AGM 25-10 BE IT RESOLVED that the Saskatchewan School Boards Association advocate to the Government of Saskatchewan and the Ministry of Education to develop and implement a Northern Teacher Recruitment and Retention Strategy, in collaboration with northern school divisions, to include but not be limited to: • Increased funding for northern and remote living allowances; • Support for developing and maintaining teacher housing; • Incentives for post-secondary teacher education students to complete internships and practicum placements in northern schools; • Expanded professional learning, mentorship, and wellness supports for teachers in northern communities; and • Partnerships to promote northern teaching careers and improve long-term retention.

Ongoing - Management leads: Ted Amendt & Darren McKee

- Saskatchewan Educational Leadership Unit (SELU) has been contracted by the SSBA to conduct a literature review and to engage with a representative sample of rural, remote, and northern boards on this matter. When their project concludes in 2026, their final report is intended to

provide the required literature and research analysis to inform the development of a provincial strategy for northern, rural, and remote education. SELU will provide an interim report at 2026 Spring Assembly.
