Section 1A: Anishinaabe Language Families and Dialects



There are other designations for Anishinaabemowin depending on the region. Some other ones are Ojibwe, Saulteaux, Nakawe, or Chippewa. Whatever the name is given to the language, the speakers all understand one another although there may be some differences in dialects.

Anishinaabemowin is part of a larger language family as shown in the map below. https://www.uottawa.ca/clmc/algonquin-family

It is called the Algonquian language family and some examples of the First Nation languages in Canada and the United States include: Cree, Montagnais/Innu, Pottawotomi, Ottawa, Algonquin, Mi'kmaq, Malecite, Abenaki, Delaware, and Menominee.
