Update on Provincial Education Plan Development

The Provincial Education Planning Secretariat provided an update in February on the development of a Provincial Education Plan (PEP).

A Provincial Education Council was appointed by the Minister of Education to provide guidance and strategic oversight and to make recommendations to the Minister.

The PEP will focus on the needs of all Pre-Kindergarten to Grade 12 students. It will unite partners in a shared vision, focus efforts on improved results and encourage collaborative work across the province. The plan will also support the goals of Saskatchewan's Growth Plan, released in fall 2019.

The Provincial Education Plan operational structure recently adopted the formal title of "The Provincial Education Plan Implementation Team" (PEPIT). It consists of directors of education, participating First Nations education authorities, two representatives of


Saskatchewan Teachers' Federation Professional Learning and senior ministry officials. It is responsible for the development and implementation of the PEP.

The PEPIT has begun creating a one-year interim priority plan to be implemented in the 2021-2022 school year, that responds to the pressures experienced by school systems resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic. The interim plan will include key actions to meet the needs of all students in the areas of reading and learning gaps, and mental health and well-being. Directors of Education will present the plan to boards of education for endorsement in spring 2021. The Provincial Education Council will seek the endorsement of the Minister of Education.

Later in 2021, the PEPIT will continue to develop a long-term provincial plan to guide education to 2030. Boards of education and the Minister will have the opportunity to

review and endorse the long-term plan in late 2021 or early 2022. Implementation of the long-term plan will begin in fall 2022.

The Education Sector Strategic Plan (2014-2021) is in its final cycle, continuing to provide guidance to the education sector in this 2020-21 school year. It will sunset in June.
