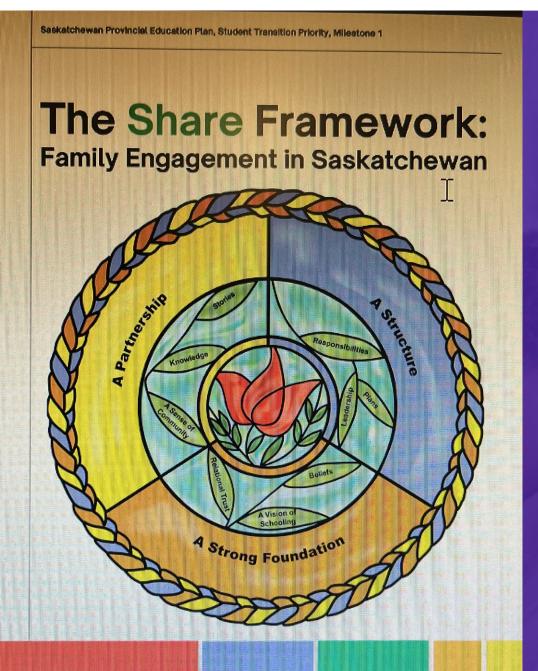

Knowledge of the sector and the organization (division, school)

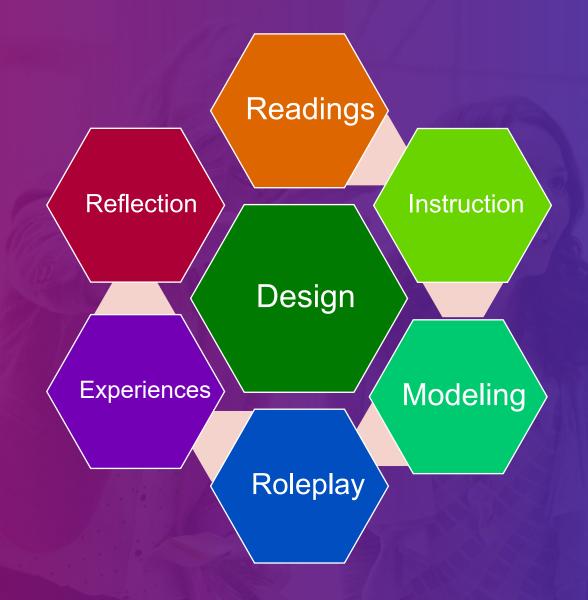

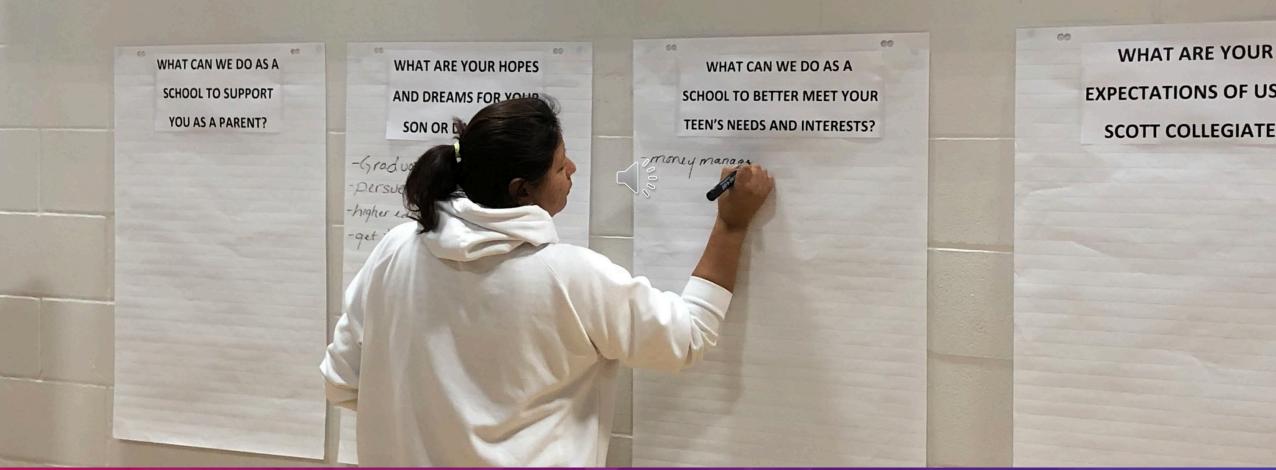
SSBA Leadership: Connect SCC Leadership to Action

Develop shared responsibility for the learning success and well-being of all children and youth.

Encourage and facilitate parent and community engagement in school planning and improvement processes.

- Expectations are set in legislation.
- How are these expectations translated into SCC plans, processes, deliverables?
- What accountabilities are in place, and set by whom?
- What are the monitoring and support systems?
- What are the recording and reporting systems?
- How is cross SCC sharing/learning facilitated within the division?
