♦ How the program addresses the following criteria:

1. Direct board influence and participation in the innovation

In 2013, the Board of Education approved the football program as well as approved the purchase of all the equipment for 8 schools to outfit their teams. The Board has also purchased 15 passenger buses for school use that is widely utilized by the football teams. In 2014, the league expanded to include teams from Creighton and La Ronge Indian Band, Cumberland House, Cumberland House Cree Nation, Carpenters High School (Meadow Lake) and St Pascal School (Green Lake). In 2015, the board approved a 3 year Football Joint Sponsorship with the La Loche Community School and Clearwater River Dene Nation. The board supported the purchase of new cameras to promote many events in the schools including livestreaming the football games.

2. Innovative nature of the program or project

This is the first time in the history of Northern Lights School Division #113 that it has had a football program. The program started in 2013 as a northern region playing in its own league and is has now progressed to playing in the Sask High Schools Athletic Assoc (SHSAA) *6 Man Football Provincial Championships* in 2015. The league stretches from just inside the Alberta boarder (La Loche) to just inside the Manitoba border (Creighton). Much of the success in northern football was a result of a social networking strategy that included Livestream broadcasts of games, a website, Facebook and Twitter. A following for football quickly emerged, despite many residents who never have watched a live game before.

3. Sustainability of the innovation within the present system or school

The program will be able to support itself with support from:

4. Cost of the innovation related to benefits achieved

It is difficult to put a price tag on the football program. The initial cost was \$100,000 to get the program up and running in 2013. \$20,000 has been put in annually since then. The Division views this as an investment in the students of northern communities. The investments has paid dividends in the area of increased school attendance, prevention, harm reduction and exposure.

5. Client support for the innovation

The School Community Councils are in support of the program. Northern community pride has been instilled, as families and communities show up at the games and cheer on their new heroes.

7. Evidence of improved student achievement

- There is currently 200 students participating in this football league
- Students that were never involved in any extracurricular activities are now involved in football
- Students are attending school now that didn't attend before on a regular basis
- Students that are participating in the football program are earning more high school credits. In 2013-2014, 37 students increased the number of credits from the previous year
- There are numerous anecdotal examples of students who are successful and stay in school because of football
- The Northern Saskatchewan Football program has focused on promotion by the creation of a website, Facebook page and Twitter feed. In addition, numerous media organizations have promoted the program and participation.
